### **Remembering Two of Our Life Members**

This last month there were not one but two life members who passed away.

#### Mary Leonard

Mary Leonard, a longtime member of the League, passed away on Friday, 21 April 2017. Mary grew up in Minneapolis, met David, her husband of 60 years, at Iowa State University, and has been involved with the League for almost as long. The photo shows three generations of Leonard women on the occasion when Mary was presented with her Life Membership certificate in 2015. Mary's friends at her church speak about her passion for social justice issues: women's issues, domestic violence, health care for all, including behavioral health, and more. Daughter Julie tells us that in the different communities in which her family lived, Mary accepted many different leadership roles in her leagues. When Mary was newsletter editor, Julie recalls that the whole family would walk around the dining table, collating the pages of each issue. Shirley Jin remarked that, quite recently, Mary contributed an edit to the Campaign Finance Reform team's efforts. Although Mary's lungs' function has been compromised for a long time, she accepted and ignored her own suffering as much as possible, and took delight in often reaching out to her friends with gestures of kindness. She will be missed by many of us both in and out of the league.



### **Beverly Sabin**

Beverly Sabin died Sunday, 16 April 2017. She was one of the league members living in the Frasier community. A memorial service for Beverly is scheduled for:

1:00 pm, Saturday, 6 May Chapel, Frasier Meadows

Beverly Sabin joined the league in 1959 in Deerfield, IL, where she immediately took on a term as Voter Service chair. Beverly was then active in local leagues in Broomfield Hills, MI (1960's), Baton Rouge, LA (1970-75), and Montrose, CO, prior to moving to Boulder County in 2002. In Baton Rouge Bev found herself part of an influx of Northerners who brought a different perspective while working to support ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment and to improve miserable conditions in Louisiana's prisons.

Beverly believed that the league made a difference by helping women become more active politically and noted that social and political changes are reflected in changes in fashion, i.e., the acceptance of pants as business attire for women. Bev's main interests and area for activism have been schools and libraries, not surprising since she had her Master's degree in Library Science.

## We're Popping Our Buttons !

### **Congratulations to Mary Ann Wilner**

Mary Ann Wilner has been named co-winner of the LWVCO Individual Achievement Award for 2017 for her work on Living Wage. Mary Ann led the Social Policy Team, our League, and our community in a successful campaign to bring Living Wage to city of Boulder employees, and continues to lead a promising effort to bring Living Wage to employees of Boulder County and the rest of its municipalities.

Her leadership has increased our League's visibility and attracted new people to our League and the Social Policy Team. It has energized community members who advocate fair wages and, in particular, an adequate Living Wage. Our expertise and our persistence on this issue have become widely known. Most importantly, her work has improved the working and personal lives of countless city of Boulder employees in our community.

The award will be made on 20 May at the State League convention.

### LWVBC Wins the LWVCO Community Connections Award for 2017

LWVBC won the LWVCO Community Connections Award for 2017. Every two years it is given to one large League and one small League.

The award was given for our work on Making Democracy Work for All, a national and state initiative of LWV.

During the 2016 election season LWVBC worked tirelessly on voter registration drives, candidate forums, ballot issue presentations, VOTE 411 and advocacy for Amendments 69 (Colorado Care) and Amendment 70 (minimum wage). For the first time in our history, we collaborated on three forums from the Latino perspective.

After the election LWVBC worked on innovative educational events such as Community Conversations and Drinks and Dialogue. LWVBC Issue Teams such as Social Policy, Campaign Finance Reform and Voting Methods have worked to educate our community and take action on important issues. LWVBC is reaching new audiences through the use of social media, a Speaker's Bureau, KGNU radio program, new website and membership management software. LWVBC recruited and mentored two Generation X board members from under-represented communities which has led to new innovations. LWVBC is collaborating with many organizations to reach the broader community.

The award will be presented on 20 May at the State convention.

The team was so excited by the possibilities that, when encouraged to create a position with which the state LWV might concur, they stepped up to the challenge.

way, LWVBC also acquired a new web hosting service so thank you, Deborah Hayes, for transitioning the Voting Methods page to the new site!) We've also just concluded a 3-part series of presentations on ranked-choice voting, approval voting and proportional representation, and we even spoke at the Libertarian Convention.

New in April was Colorado House Bill 1281 to allow approval voting in local, non-partisan elections. As of press deadline it had passed its first committee and was headed to the House Appropriations Committee. We'll definitely have more news to report in the next Voter.

We are working hard to communicate with members of other local Leagues about the importance of concurrence with our new voting methods position. If you know folks in other Leagues, please talk to them about our position, and if they have questions we will be happy to talk further with them. Thank you!

#### Logging In

LWVBC, however, wants the public to see and read most of the items on our site. So, when you visit, you see the public toolbar which gives you access to many things.
