It's Time to End Gerrymandering in Colorado. Vote Yes on Y and Z! By Peggy Leech

We need your help! Your mid-term election ballot will include Amendments Y and Z, to establish a fair district mapping process for Colorado. Amendment Y deals with federal congressional districts, and Amendment Z is for state legislative districts. LWVCO was involved in crafting these measures, along with organizations and individuals from both political parties and unaffiliated voters. The amendments were referred to the ballot by a <u>unanimous</u> vote of the Colorado State Legislature.

Now we need to get 55% of the vote in November, since these are constitutional amendments. That's where you come in. Please urge all of your friends to vote Yes on Y and Z. You can host a house party, to make calls or send postcards to friends and family members in Colorado, encouraging them to support fair district mapping. LWVBC was well-represented at the LWVCO Making Democracy Work Conference on September 29. The highlight was the keynote speaker, Regan Byrd, who gave an excellent presentation on Equity and Allyship, with a goal of anti-oppression work. She wove in examples from the recent Philadelphia Starbucks incident and from the Kavanaugh-Blasey Ford Senate hearing. Other conference topics included updates on the strategic planning process, the Yes on Y & Z Campaign, and the statewide ballot issues.





Our recent Fall Kickoff meeting turned out to be quite energizing, with our new student membership program featured prominently. We also heard from all of the Team Leaders, who talked about what they are working on in the upcoming year. We recognized some members with longevity awards, and we heard about a new Major Gifts program for LWVBC. And, very importantly, we had fun catching up with friends!

Our members have been working very hard all summer and fall, and will continue throughout October, getting ready for the upcoming midterm election. We appreciate everyone's efforts on voter registration drives, ballot issue research and presentations on the ballot issues, and, of course, candidate forums.
