

## Positions on 2020 Ballot Issues in Boulder County

## **City of Boulder**

- **Ballot Issue 2B, No Eviction Without Representation**: Neutral. The League supports tenant protections. However, the proposed tax process does not seem equitable.
- Ballot Question 2C, Public Service Company Franchise: Neutral. The League supports bold action to stop
  climate change and its harmful effects. However, we do not have an organizational position regarding
  franchise structures or processes.
- Ballot Question 2D, Repurpose the Utility Occupation Tax: Neutral. The League supports bold action to stop climate change and its harmful effects, including disproportionate impacts on low-income communities and communities of color. However, the proposed tax purpose and process is too unclear to determine an organizational position.
- Ballot Question 2E, Charter Amendments Related to Direct Election of the Mayor: Neutral. The League
  does not have a position on direct election of mayors. The League strongly supports and advocates for
  alternative voting methods that enable voters to effectively express their feelings about candidates but
  prefers not to take a position on a voting method that may not be technically feasible to implement, as
  proposed.
- Ballot Question 2F, Charter Amendment Related to the Boulder Arts Commission: Neutral. The League does not have a position relating to the nature of local commissions.

## **City of Longmont**

- Ballot Question 3C, Revenue Bonds for Funding Water System Improvements: Support. Our support is based on our local position to promote efficient fiscal administration, current and long range, and on our state position supporting water storage and supply efforts.
- Ballot Question 3D, Charter Amendment to Allow for 30 Year Leases: Support. Our support is based on our local position to promote efficient fiscal administration, current and long range.

## **City of Louisville**

 Ballot Issue 2A: Support. Our support is based on our local position supporting efforts to promote and manage waste reduction in Boulder County.
